



Uniting for Ukraine (U4U) Background

- Parole is an authority granted to the DHS Secretary to allow someone to enter the U.S. based on a humanitarian, urgent need and they are unable to apply for admission to the U.S. through the normal visa processing procedures
- Uniting for Ukraine provides a pathway for displaced Ukrainian citizens and their immediate family members who are outside the United States to come to the United States and stay temporarily for a two-year period of parole.
- U4U parolees can also apply for employment authorization and advance parole travel document

Defining: Temporary Protected Status (TPS)

- The Secretary of Homeland Security may designate a foreign country for TPS due to conditions in the country that temporarily prevent the country's nationals from returning safely, or in certain circumstances, where the country is unable to handle the return of its nationals adequately.
- The Secretary may designate a country for TPS due to the following temporary conditions in the country:
 - Ongoing armed conflict (such as civil war)
 - An environmental disaster (such as earthquake or hurricane), or an epidemic
 - Other extraordinary and temporary conditions

Benefits of TPS

Does not lead to a permanent status

- ✓ Provides temporary lawful status in the U.S. while you are determining next steps to secure permanent status
- ✓ Eligible for employment authorization (Form I-765) and advance parole travel document (Form I-131)
- ✓ Employment authorization document code (a12) is eligible for the 540-day automatic extension



How to Apply for TPS

- Submit Form I-821 by paper or online
- 2. Include fee of \$50 for initial and \$85 for biometrics; or fee waiver request
- 3. Include evidence:
 - ✓ Identity and nationality,
 - ✓ date of entry, and
 - ✓ continuous residence since 4/16/23

- 4. Can also apply for employment authorization (Form I-765) concurrently
- 5. Attend biometrics appointment
- Wait for decision from USCIS



• TPS I-131 Advance Parole: 17.5 months of less






Defining: Asylum

- Permanent status
- Protection for those who has faced persecution or has a fear of persecution based on the 5 qualifying grounds: race, religion, national origin, political opinion, or social membership
- Eligible for employment authorization and refugee travel document
- Can apply for qualifying family members (in or outside the U.S.) as derivative asylum (Form I-730)
- Can apply for a green card anytime after being granted asylum



How to apply for asylum

- Submit Form I-589 by paper or online filing
 - No fee required for application or biometrics
- Attend biometrics appointment
- Prepare for interview by visiting USCIS webpage
- 4. Attend asylum interview
- 5. Wait for decision from USCIS





I-821, Application for Temporary Protected Status

1 ALERT: Certain TPS beneficiaries and applicants who electronically filed Form I-765, Application for Employment Authorization, did not receive a receipt notice or their receipt notice did not include language about the <u>540-day automatic Employment Authorization Document (EAD) extension</u>. On or before the week of March 13, we will send these applicants an email and/or text notification instructing them to sign into their USCIS online account and obtain a corrected, printable receipt notice. We will also send corrected paper receipt notices by mail. Please note that, if you are a TPS beneficiary and your TPS country designation is still current, you are authorized to work. However, you must obtain your corrected receipt notice to present when completing Form I-9, Employment Eligibility Verification. If you are eligible for the 540-day automatic EAD extension, any USCIS receipt notice for your Form I-765-- together with your expired EAD-- will serve as acceptable proof of employment authorization and EAD validity during the automatic extension period.

If you believe you are an eligible national of a designated country or a person without nationality who last habitually resided in the designated country, use this form to apply for Temporary Protected Status (TPS). When filing an initial TPS application or re-registering for TPS, you can also request an Employment Authorization Document (EAD) by submitting a completed Form I-765, Request for Employment Authorization, when you file

You may also file your Form I-765 request separately at a later date.
